# Improve the Safety of Medication



SALADs are medications that may be confused for one another and lead to potentially harmful medication errors. The hospital SALAD list is based on medication incident reports and on international lists of confused drug names.

#### **Concentrated Electrolytes**

These are concentrated solutions of electrolytes that require dilution or other preparation before intravenous administration. In SVUH, these include: potassium chloride ampoules, potassium phosphate ampoules, and magnesium sulphate 50% (higher strength) ampoules.



### High Alert Medications

These are drugs that bear a heightened risk of causing patient harm when they are used in error. In SVUH, the high alert list includes insulin, opioids, anticoagulants and neuromuscular blocking agents.

- Ensure correct drug identification
- Correct patient identification
- Safe administration
