

Patient Safety Goal 5

Reduce the Risk of Health Care Associated Infections

Hand hygiene reduces risk of healthcare-associated infections.

How can I, as a member of staff, contribute to this goal?

- **1.** Use alcohol hand rub for hand hygiene except in the following situations, hands must be washed with soap and water when:
 - Hands are visibly soiled
 - Caring for patients with known or suspected Clostridioides Difficile infection
- 2. Clean hands according to the WHO '5 moments for hand hygiene':
 - Before patient contact
 - Before an aseptic / clean procedure
 - After exposure to blood or body fluid
 - After patient contact
 - After contact with patient surroundings
- 3. Clean hands before and after wearing gloves
- 4. Use standard precautions for all patients
- **5.** Use transmission based precautions for patients with confirmed or suspected infection (e.g. MRSA, VRE, CPE, *Clostridioides Difficile* infection, TB, Norovirus, Covid-19)
