Anaphylaxis Education Programme

About

This National Anaphylaxis Education Programme (HSE) prepares Health Care Provider (HCP) to recognize, treat and manage anaphylaxis in hospital and community settings.

Who is eligible?

Registered Nurses, Midwives, Doctors, Dentists.

How is it delivered?

Blended learning, one module on HSELand, National Anaphylaxis Education Programme for healthcare professionals and a workshop incorporating practical and case scenarios.

Once completed the on-line component must be renewed 2 yearly.

Staff Nurses who are required to obtain competence in the administration of Intravenous Medications

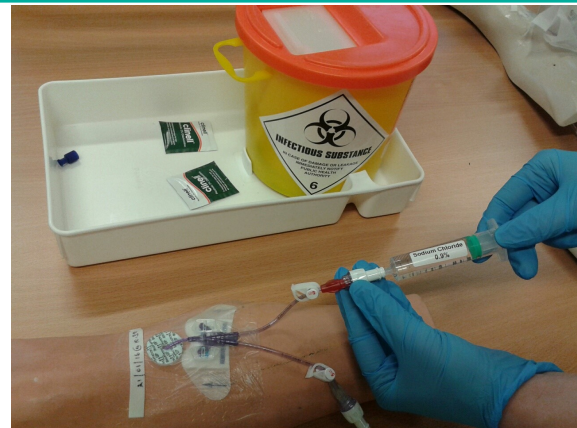

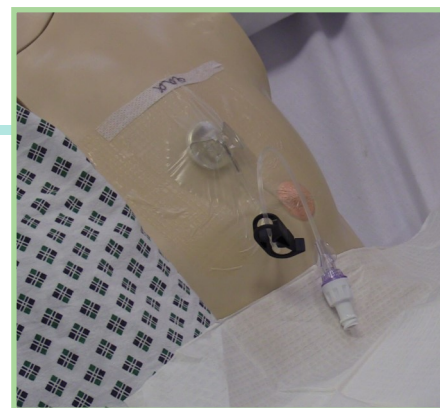

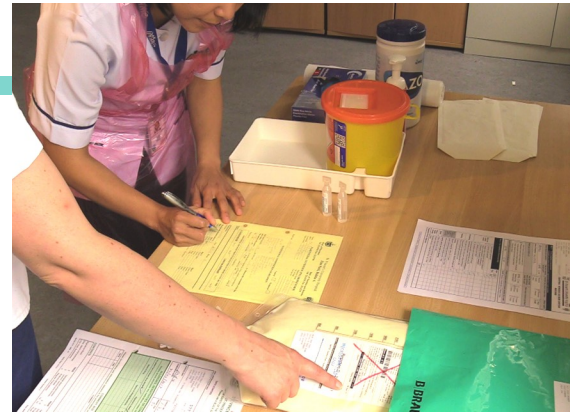

Venepuncture and Cannulation Workshop

About

The aim of this course is to assist the RGN in developing the skills necessary to perform Venepuncture and Cannulation in clinical practice

Who is eligible?

Peritoneal Dialysis Skills Education Programme

About

The education programme is designed to enhance participants' academic knowledge and clinical skills in peritoneal dialysis to provide an out-of-hours emergency service.

Cardiac Rhythm Recognition Skills

About

The primary focus of this course is on the development of practical nursing skills in Electrocardiograph (ECG) basic rhythm interpretation.

During the course the participants will gain the knowledge required to interpret a normal ECG waveform using a systematic approach. They will also learn how to interpret the most common Atrial and Ventricular arrhythmias, and the immediate first line nursing management of the patient.

On successful completion of the online learning Units, a clinical workbook and theoretical exam each participant will be awarded a St. Vincent's University Hospital Certificate.

Who is eligible?

Post Graduate Nurses working in the clinical areas in SVUH where ECG interpretation is required.

How is it delivered?

Theoretical component;

The theoretical component is delivered in the form of learning units. Participants must complete four learning units in-advance of attending the supportive workshops. Admittance to the workshops will not be permitted if all learning units are not completed.

Advanced Cardiac Rhythm Recognition Skills (Telemetry)

About

The aim of the programme is to provide the post graduate nurse with the opportunity to further develop and enhance their theoretical knowledge and clinical skills, in the management of patients Telemetry findings remotely and within the Cardiology Department, through patient intervention and referral pathways, within their scope of nursing practice.

Upon successful completion of the 2 day theoretical and skills programme, ECG written examination, supernumerary 2 day placement and completion of the required clinical competencies, each participant will be awarded a St. Vincent's University Hospital Certificate.

Who is eligible?

Post Graduate Nurses working in the Cardiology Department and caring for patients on Telemetry remotely and within the Cardiology Department.

How is it delivered?

Theoretical & Skills component:

The theoretical and Clinical Skills component is delivered by Cardiology Clinical Facilitators in the Classroom.

Assessment component:

Participants must complete an Advanced Rhythm Interpretation written examination and achieve clinical competency in the management of multiple patients on Telemetry monitoring, remotely and within the Cardiology Department.

Clinical Competency component:

Each student will complete a 2 day supernumerary Telemetry placement in order to achieve and assess clinical competency.

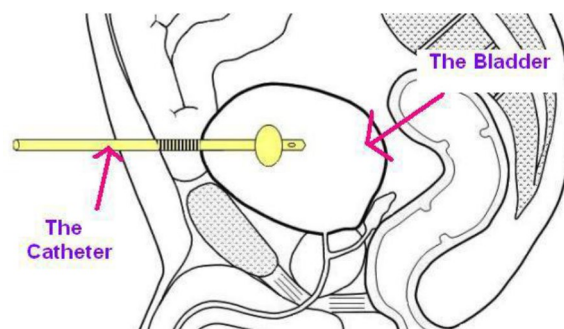

THESE DRESSING SUGGESTIONS ARE FOR ALL OPEN WOUNDS E.G. SKIN TEARS, BURST BLISTERS, LEG ULCERS, PRESSURE ULCERS		
Goes on all wounds:		& 
Necrotic/ Sloughy:		& 
Infected: Stop using once signs of infection have gone (usually 3-4 days)		& 
Large ooze: (i.e. at least daily changes) Stop using once ooze reduces		& Wound pad
Cavity/deep wounds:		& 
Odour:	Dressing (don't use gels) and then on outside use this.	& 



- Change dressings twice a week **max** unless they are wet or fall off
 - Only use Adaptic and Allevyn on wounds on toe/heel/foot unless TVN, Vascular or Plastic surgeons instruct otherwise
 - **DO NOT dress red areas**
 - Only ever use wound pads over Aquacel
 - DO NOT use gauze as a dressing/cover
 - Try a dressing selection for a minimum of **2 weeks** and then reassess (i.e. measurements, amount of tissue types in the wound bed) to see if it is working!
 - Allevyn Life can be used if the patient does not have paper thin skin.
 - Adaptic only stops other dressings from sticking to the wound- what is over it is the dressing that will "do the work"
 - Use TG fix to secure non-adhesive dressings. Try to avoid using bandages
 - Do not dress cellulitis- wounds can be dressed once cellulitis resolves
